



## INSIDE THE NFL

Host James Brown anchors INSIDE THE NFL on SHOWTIME with All Pro NFL greats Cris Collinsworth and Phil Simms serving as expert analysts. INSIDE THE NFL, now in its 34th season, is produced by CBS Sports and NFL Films. The executive producers are CBS Sports Chairman Sean McManus and NFL Films. Pete Radovich Jr., the Emmy Award-winning Creative Director for CBS Sports, serves as coordinating producer.

In 2008, INSIDE THE NFL was reborn on SHOWTIME, earning the Emmy Award for Outstanding Studio Show—Weekly, a noteworthy feat for program in its first season on a new network. Since its premiere in 1977, the heart of the one-hour show has been its exclusive and award-winning game highlights from NFL Films, as well as its storied roster of talent recapping the weekend's games and previewing the match-ups for the week ahead.

## THE CAST



**JAMES BROWN** is in his fifth year as host of the Emmy-Award winning INSIDE THE NFL on SHOWTIME. Brown returned to CBS Sports as host for the CBS Television Network's NFL pre-game show, THE NFL TODAY in 2006. Brown will again anchor THE NFL TODAY along with analysts Dan Marino, Shannon Sharpe, Boomer Esiason and Bill Cowher. Brown has hosted the Network's Super Bowl pre-game show for its coverage of Super Bowl XLIV (2010) and Super Bowl XLI (2007) in Miami, and will do so again this year for Super Bowl XLVII in New Orleans. Brown's first book, *Role of a Lifetime: Reflections on Faith, Family and Significant Living*, was published in September 2009. Throughout his career he has earned numerous awards, including three Emmy® Awards for Outstanding Studio Host for THE NFL TODAY (2007) and "FOX NFL Sunday" (1998, 1999)."



**PHIL SIMMS** Super Bowl XXI MVP and 15-year NFL veteran serves as Analyst for INSIDE THE NFL for the second season. Simms joined CBS Sports in January 1998 as lead analyst for the CBS Television Network's coverage of the NFL. This season, he and Jim Nantz pair for their ninth year as the Network's lead NFL announce team and will once again handle the call for CBS Sports' coverage of Super Bowl XLVII. In addition, this season along with Steve Beuerlein and Rich Gannon, Simms will co-host a weekly show, NFL MONDAY QB, on the CBS Sports Network. As an All-Pro quarterback, Simms led the New York Giants to two Super Bowl titles. He completed 22 of 25 passes in Super Bowl XXI as the Giants defeated the Denver Broncos, 39-20, to win their first Super Bowl title.



**CRIS COLLINSWORTH** enjoyed a sensational career as an NFL wide receiver before making a smooth transition to sports broadcasting. In 2008, the veteran *INSIDE THE NFL* analyst Collinsworth joined James Brown, Phil Simms and Warren Sapp for *INSIDE THE NFL*'s debut on SHOWTIME. Collinsworth's television career began in 1989 as a reporter for HBO's *INSIDE THE NFL*. The following season he graduated to the show's studio cast where he served as co-host until the end of the 2007 NFL season. In 2009, Collinsworth was named lead game analyst for NBC Sports, replacing John Madden. He and Al Michaels partner on the Sunday Night Football broadcasts. To date, he's earned 13 Emmy® Awards; include five for "outstanding sports personality" making him one of the most honored studio analysts in sports television.
